“THE NAME ABOVE ALL NAMES”

(Philippians 2:1-11)

What does “*Jesus is Lord*” mean to you? Does it mean that Jesus is significant? Does it mean He has a place at the bargaining table of your priorities?

“*Lord*” means more than that. It means He is in control. It means He sets the agenda. It means He makes the rules. It means His purposes prevail. It means He is Master and sovereign over all, in all, above all. He’s Lord if you choose to follow Him and no less Lord if you deny Him. The Bible promises that the day will come when every knee will bow and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord. Today is a great day to make it so.

“Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father” (Philippians 2:9-11, NIV).

“And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy” (Colossians 1:18, NIV).

“For this very reason, Christ died and returned to life so that he might be the Lord of both the dead and the living” (Romans 14:9, NIV).
