"THE LIGHT OF PEACE"

(Luke 2:8-14)

1. Real peace is having <u>a relationship with Jesus Christ</u>.

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace... But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed" (Isaiah 9:6; 53:5, ESV).

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" (Luke 2:14, ESV).

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 5:1, ESV).

2. Real peace is knowing that God will never stop loving me.

"Though he slay me, I will hope in him" (Job 13:15, ESV).

"The Lord will withhold no good thing from those who do what is right" (Psalm 84:11, NLT).

"[Nothing...] will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:39, ESV).

3. Real peace is knowing that God will never leave me alone.

"I will not fail you or abandon you" (Joshua 1:5, NLT).

"No, I will not abandon you as orphans—I will come to you" (John 14:18, NLT).

"That's my parting gift to you. Peace. I don't leave you the way you're used to being left—feeling abandoned, bereft" (John 14:27, The Message).

4. Real peace means that no matter what happens God <u>is going to</u> give me the strength to handle it.

"The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit" (Psalm 34:18, ESV).

5. Real peace is living by God's Word, the Bible.

"Great peace have those who love your law; nothing can make them stumble" (Psalm 119:165, ESV).
